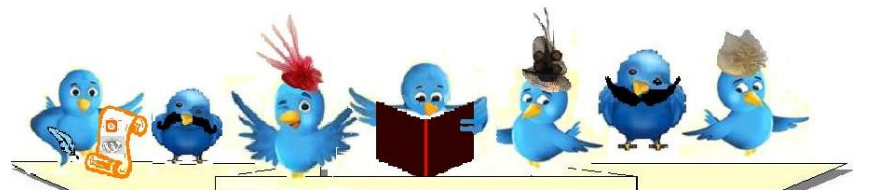
It is also the month when reviews are made of the current year and plans are made for Christmas and the year to come.

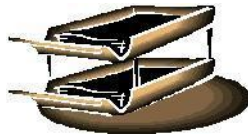

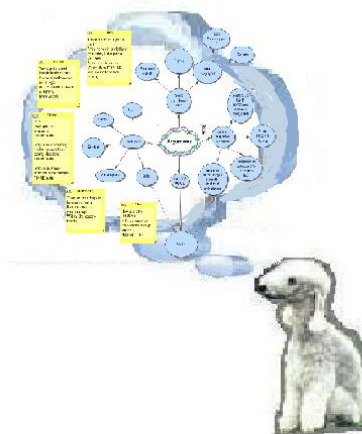

Born Storytellers Holiday Program - Discovering the writer within...

Kevin Price's writing workshops allows young writers to develop a range of skills required by writers in the creation of stories. This series of workshops is suitable for students in year 4 onwards. Participants are to bring a notebook, pen, dictionary and thesaurus. The cost of the writing workshop (4 x 3hrs) is \$140. Tuesday 4th Jan 9-12 noon.

Session One: *Observation and Ekphrases*. Students will learn how to observe, and practise writing detailed visual pieces, exploring techniques for writing vivid images.

Wednesday 5th Jan 9- 12 noon.

Session Two: *Naturalness and Flow*. Students will learn techniques of free writing, looking at ways they can tap into the natural flow of writing and make use of flow as part of their expression. They will explore writing in partnership to further enhance their understanding of 'flow'.

Thursday 6th Jan 9-12 noon.

Session Three: *Visualising and Change*. Students will explore situations that can be changed through writing, learning about the power of writing as a medium of change and a force for seeing things differently.

Friday 7th Jan 9 – 12 noon

Session Four: *Clarity and Simplicity*. Students will explore ways of improving the clarity of their writing and developing an understanding of the power of simple form and language, and the difference between descriptive writing and clutter.

Born Storytellers Holiday Program – Discovering the artist within...

Judith Price's drawing workshops allows young artists to develop a range of drawing skills. Her philosophy is that drawing is the basis of all art and expression, and to learn drawing skills at a young age puts students in a position of great advantage. Judith will teach observation skills and ways to transpose what a student sees onto the page. She will focus on basic shapes and how all objectives can be observed through the basic shapes, allowing students' drawing to become more organic and less mechanical. The cost of the drawing workshop (4 x 3 hrs) is \$180.
