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

We think what we see, hear and feel is real. But is that really the case? The Perception/Deception exhibition allows us to explore:

- Audio-language perception, such as phonemic restoration and how the human brain handles noise and language.

WISE ONES BENDIGO AND CASTLEMAINE AREA

The WiseOnes program for fast learners is now available as a support to schools, students and families in the Bendigo area. Dr Karen Ward, a local artist and educator, has taken on a Licence to introduce and offer the program in Bendigo and Castlemaine. We have made an initial visit to several schools indicating that they can now offer students a cost neutral, no fuss, gifted program that has been operating in Melbourne for 16 years.

The WiseOnes program is based on research in gifted education, is multidisciplinary, fast paced, more complex and different. It challenge thinking, it provides a place for like minds to meet and big ideas to flourish. This type of program has been shown as second only to acceleration as a statistically effective provision for the gifted child. Children from Year 1 to 8 can have appropriate learning opportunities in a fast group where they feel at home.

All children are assessed, at no fee, with recognized tests for potential, not necessarily achievement, since a few have a disability as well as advanced ability and some have learned to underachieve or hide for peer acceptance. Some are hard to recognize without testing. They are the most in need of such a program. Parents are the most successful at identifying the potential of gifted children.


