TOPIC: Giftedness and autism

Autism Spectrum Conditions are diagnosed in individuals with a wide range of abilities, including those who are gifted. While there is considerable knowledge available to educators and parents about autism and giftedness separately, there has been relatively little research in relation to educational provision for gifted children on the autism spectrum. Susan will examine some of the available literature and introduce case studies of gifted individuals on the autism spectrum. The session will focus on:

- · differentiating characteristics of autism from those of giftedness
- · understanding the unique strengths and weaknesses of individuals who are both gifted and on the autism spectrum
- providing appropriate support at home and school

Susan will highlight the important role of parents in assisting these 'twice-exceptional' learners.

Susan Wade is a PhD candidate in the Faculty of Education at Monash University. Her research focuses on gifted individuals on the autism spectrum. She is also an educational consultant and experienced secondary teacher. Susan holds a Bachelor of Arts (Hons) from The University of Melbourne, a Graduate Diploma of Education (Secondary), and a Master's degree in Education (specialising in Gifted Education) from Monash University. She has given seminars, conference presentations and staff professional development sessions relating to education, giftedness and the autism spectrum. Susan has been awarded the Monash University / Herald Sun Victorian Graduate Teacher of the Year, a Creative Innovation Asia Pacific Innovation Leader scholarship, an ASfAR / APEX Autism Trust Award and the ASfAR Margot Prior Prize. She is passionate about seeing individuals on the autism spectrum reach their potential.

We have a team of Swinburne University final year students building us a more user friendly web site which will be launched in early June 2016.




