For the greater part of Hebrew history, the Hebrews, through no choice of their own, have been a wandering people. They were frequently driven from their lands by famine or by invaders and exiled to other lands such as Egypt and Babylon. The Ten Commandments

On the third day, the people gathered eagerly at the foot of the mountain, upon which appeared a thick cloud. Suddenly there was a terrific thunderstorm and a very loud trumpet blast was heard. All the people trembled.

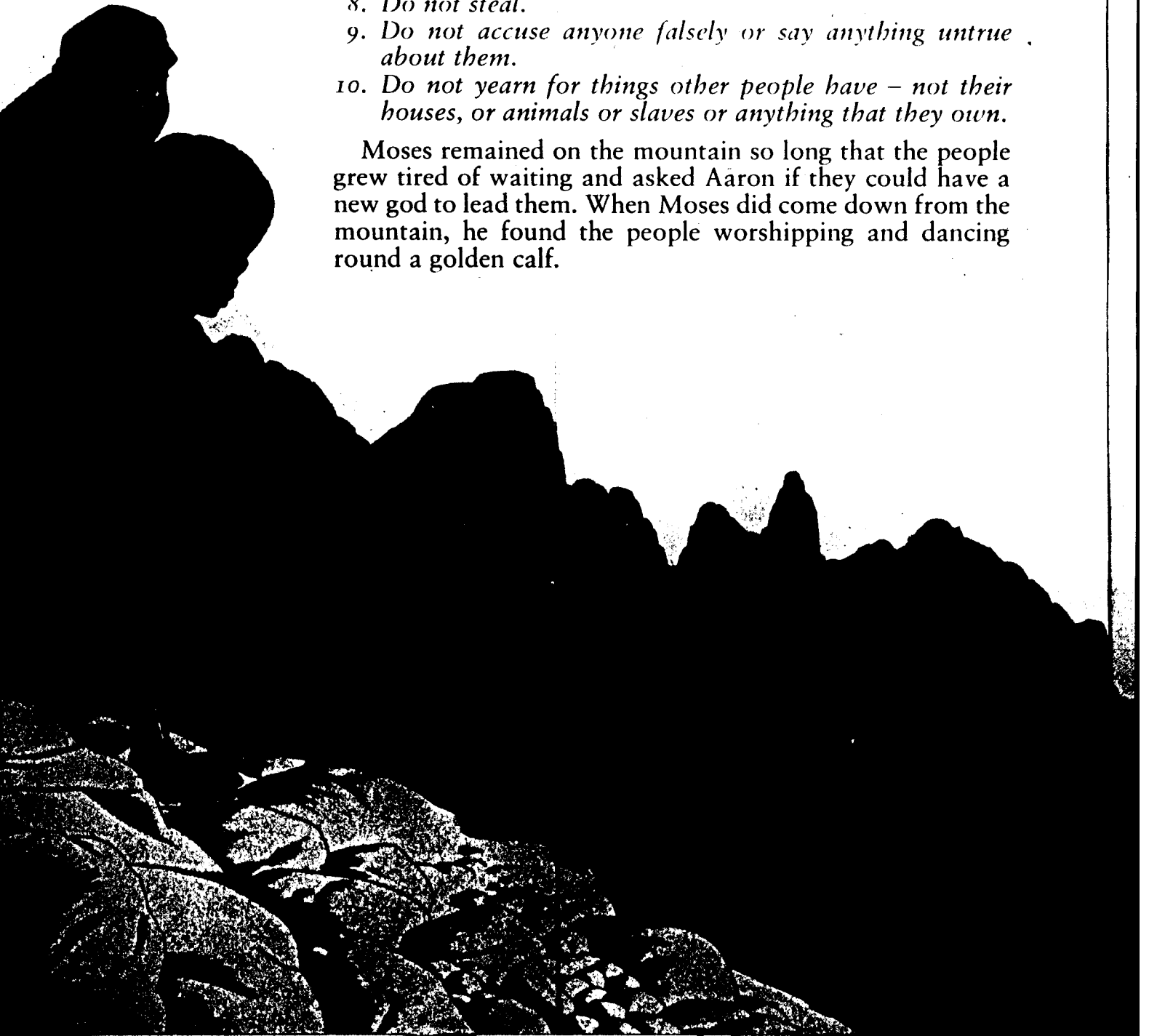
Then Moses himself climbed the mountain, and was lost to sight in the cloud. There God gave him ten commandments written on two tablets of stone.



These were God's Ten Commandments:

1. *You shall not have any other gods but me.*
2. *You shall not worship carved images or statues.*
3. *Do not use my name lightly or for evil purposes.*
4. *You must keep the sabbath day holy and use it for a day of rest. I made the world in six days and rested on the seventh, and that is why I blessed it and made it a holy day.*
5. *Honour and respect your parents.*
6. *Do not kill.*
7. *Do not take away another person's husband or wife.*
8. *Do not steal.*
9. *Do not accuse anyone falsely or say anything untrue about them.*
10. *Do not yearn for things other people have – not their houses, or animals or slaves or anything that they own.*

Moses remained on the mountain so long that the people grew tired of waiting and asked Aaron if they could have a new god to lead them. When Moses did come down from the mountain, he found the people worshipping and dancing round a golden calf.

The kingdom of God

The Jews looked upon Yahweh as a king. They expected that the realm of God would be eventually acknowledged and there would be an everlasting kingdom. Just prior to the Christian era there was a strengthening of this notion, so that Yahweh's Rule over people was seen as the endpoint of all history. The Jews of the centuries immediately preceding the Christian era spoke of the distinction between This Age and The Age to Come. In The Age to Come, Yahweh would rule supreme.

Thus Jesus could come to his people and announce that the Rule (or kingdom) of God was at hand. The Rule of God had become a reality first of all in Jesus and thereafter in those who accepted him. The Christian community is the gathering to-

gether of those who have entered the kingdom. Their fundamental prayer is for the fulfilment of the Rule, the day when all people would accept the final Rule of God.

Our Father in heaven,
May your name be held holy!
May your kingdom [Rule] come,
your will be done,
on earth as in heaven!

The petitions are synonyms, all expressing the same entreaty for the coming of the Rule of God. The community of the baptised is already the establishment of that Rule.

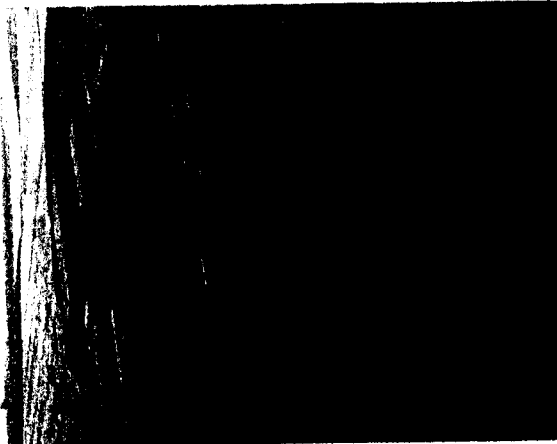


The range of mountains among which Mount Sinai is to be found.

part of Palestine is also desert, the triangle-shaped Negev. The western part is a level or slightly undulating plain; the eastern sector is hilly, badly eroded, and stony hammada desert. The Negev and Sinai to the south were the scene of Israel's wanderings before their settlement in 'the land'.

The central backbone of folded limestone north of the Negev forms various low mountain chains from Judea through Samaria to lower Galilee. Upper Galilee consists of recent basalt lavas that break through the limestone cover. It is overlooked by Mt Lebanon with its peaks rising over 3,300 feet/1,005m and continued northwards into the Ansariye mountains. This hilly backbone was the nucleus of Israelite territory. East of these chains is the system of rift valleys, laced together by the Jordan Valley between the Lake of Galilee and the Dead Sea in the south, while the Orontes-Hama-Ghab depressions continue the geological fracture north into Syria.

The coastal plain.



The coast north of Gaza consists of a broad belt of shifting sand dunes that narrows progressively from Jaffa/Tel Aviv northwards there is sufficient moisture to provide a vegetation cover that inhibits the further spread of dunes, and this stretch as far as the Yarkon River was Philistine territory. The Plain of Sharon between the Yarkon and Crocodile rivers was swampy, or heavily forested, and formed a buffer zone between Philistia and Phoenicia, in whose sparsely settled area the tribe of Ephraim obtained a foothold. North of Mt Carmel the coast is more rocky and indented, and here the Phoenicians established their power in the natural harbours of Tyre and Sidon.

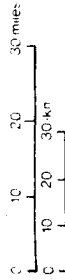
