Giftedness Researchers' Support and Discussion Forum

This group is open to Australians and New Zealanders undertaking research related to giftedness, to provide mutual support and a forum for sharing ideas. Membership of the group requires that the person is carrying out empirical or clinical research in the giftedness field, in association with a university, school, psychology practice or similar. Examples include university academics, Honours, Masters and PhD students and psychologists collecting clinical data.

Being such a small and often misunderstood field of research, it is hoped this group will help giftedness researchers feel connected with others who speak the same 'language' and share the same concerns... and as a result maintain their energy and 'voice' in furthering how gifted children and adults are understood. New researchers and those who feel isolated within their universities are particularly encouraged to join, as are experienced researchers who can offer their support and advice.
