

### **Giftedness Researchers' Support and Discussion Forum**

## A LETTER FROM DR HARRY MILNE

Dear Colleagues,

I have recently received two requests, one from Professor Joe Renzulli and Professor Sally Reis, from the National research Center on the Gifted and Talented and the Neag Center for Gifted Education and Talent Development, at the University of Connecticut and the second from Professor Del Siegle, President of the National Association for Gifted Children (NAGC), USA and Conference Program Chair.

They have all asked me if I would circulate information they think may be of interest to educators and parents working with Gifted Children in the hope that you may be able to include it on your website or in one of your journals or newsletter. Specific permission has been granted by Joe and Sally to reprint their introductory paper (<u>renzulli@uconnvm.uconn.edu</u>). I apologise for the lateness of this notice, but I have been very ill.

Joe and Sally will be well known names to most people in the field. They have now developed the Renzulli Learning System (RLS), This is a student centred, web based program that incorporates the "Total Talent Portfolio",

"Curriculum Compacting", Enrichment Triad Model", "SPAF" authentic evaluation tool, and other elements of the "Schoolwide Enrichment Model". A

very brief introductory article is included below and a descriptive Figure is attached.

Del Siegle is particularly interested in encouraging people involved in the field to attend the NAGC Conference – more below. He has added an International strand to the Minneapolis, NAGC conference to encourage international researchers, presenters, and delegates to attend. #### A Time Saving Tool for High-End Learning: A Computerized Strength Assessment and Internet Based Enrichment Program

Joseph S. Renzulli Sally M. Reis The University of Connecticut

Although "differentiation" is the contemporary buzzword in curriculum and

instruction these days, high-end learning requires that teachers have the time and resources to do it well. Remarkable advances in instructional communication technology (ICT) have now made is possible to provide high levels of enrichment and the kinds of differentiation that facilitated advanced learning services to students who have access to a computer and the Internet. We have incorporated more than 30 years of research on talent development into the Renzulli Learning System (RLS), which is a strength-oriented Internet based enrichment program that is built on a high-end learning theory that focuses on the development of creative productivity through the application of knowledge rather than the mere acquisition and storage of knowledge. The Renzulli Learning System goes beyond the popular "worksheets-on-line" or courses on line that, by and large, have been early applications of ICT in most school situations. These early applications have been based on the same pedagogy that is regularly practiced in most traditional teaching situations, thereby minimizing the full capacity of ICT, and in many cases simply turning the Internet into a gigantic encyclopedia rather than a source of information for the application of knowledge in powerful learning situations.

The Renzulli Learning System is a comprehensive program that begins by providing a computer-generated profile of each student's academic strengths, interests, learning styles, and preferred modes of expression. A search engine then matches Internet resources to the student's profile from

fourteen carefully screened data-bases that are categorized by subject area, grade level, state curricular standards, and degree of complexity. There are also hundreds of enrichment activities that can be down loaded and reproduced for individual or group learning activities. A management system called the Wizard Project Maker guides students in the application of knowledge to teacher or student selected assignments, independent research studies, or creative projects that individuals or small groups would like to pursue. Students and teachers can evaluate the quality of students' products using a rubric called The Student Product Assessment Form. Students can rate each site visited, conduct a self-assessment of what they have gained from the site, and place resources in their own Total talent Portfolio for future use. RLS also includes a curriculum acceleration management system for high achieving students that is based on the many years of research and widespread use of a popular differentiation process called Curriculum Compacting.

Teacher functions allow downloading of hundreds of reproducible creativity and critical thinking activities as well as numerous off-line resources for lesson planning and curricular integration. Management functions allow teachers to group students by interests and learning styles. The management tools also allow teachers to place teacher-selected resources in individual, whole class, or selected students' portfolios for classroom or special project use. Teachers can oversee all students' activity including where and when students have been on-line using the RLS, projects or assignments underway or completed, and areas where curriculum has been compacted. The system can be used at home and during summer, and parents can view their own son or daughter's work on the system. The principal or designated project manager can also examine all activity taking place in a given building or program. This feature allows for accountability, system assessment, and guidance in staff development and program planning needs.
