# An important message from Professor Miraca Gross, Director of GERRIC, about the Academic Talent Search, 2008

The Academic Talent Search is a unique testing program for academically gifted students from years 3-9. It was initiated by the Gifted Education Research, Resource and Information Centre (GERRIC) at the University of New South Wales. The Talent Search has been run each year for 10 years and has benefited many students, families and schools.

I am writing to inform you that in 2008 the Talent Search will be put on hold until 2009. After 10 years of running the program, it is essential that we take time to reassess this model of testing to ensure it is the most useful, valuable, affordable, and enjoyable that it can be.

We will be re-examining elements such as content of the exams, exam procedure, results reports, cost and the possibility of finding a sponsor to reduce costs for families. We are very confident a re-evaluation and improvement the Talent Search program will make it even better!

We would really love your ideas on this program. Whether you have participated in the exam before, or your child has, or your school has, or you have never heard of the Talent Search, your opinion is very valuable to us! #### **FAQS**

My child will be in year 9 in 2008 while the Talent Search is on hold. Does this mean he/she will miss out on their last opportunity to test?

If your child is in year 9 in 2008, we don't want them to miss their last opportunity to benefit from the Talent Search. When we start the Talent Search again in 2009, your child will be in year 10, and so we will allow year 10 students to take part in the test just for 2009.

#### Will the residential programs be running in 2008?

The residential programs are for students who have performed extremely well in the Talent Search that was run that year. We are reassessing the residential programs and so these will also be put on hold until we begin the Talent Search again. When we start these again, we will invite high performers from the Talent Search that year, including year 10 students.

#### When will registration open for the next Talent Search?

At this stage, we are not sure in which month the Talent Search will be held in 2009. Registrations open 3 months before the test. You can register online or by paper, details will be found on our website. We will send updates next year to give you information on the reassessment of the Talent Search and details of when it will be held.

# EXCITING NEW VENUE FOR OGTOC ONLINE GIFTED CONFERENCES!

### Here is a letter from Sally L. the list mom of OGTOC

The link noted above is an invitation to join the new NING website for OGTOC.

Please copy and past the above noted link in your internet browser if it is not clickable in this message.

You will be asked to join the new NING OGTOC social network.

NOTICE: Be certain that the email address you choose is what you want your online identity to be. I will not edit, delete, change any email addresses or content posted by your chosen identity. Do not have third party entities contact me to address online identity requests, issues, etc.

Once you join the new NING OGTOC social network with your chosen online identity:) You will find many additional groups to join as part of the new NING OGTOC website.

Be sure to join the Mary Ruth Coleman PhD group to be part of the conference.

Traditionally OGTOC is only active during conferences. This is a new opportunity for you to join one or many groups which are more specific to various interests within gifted. You can now post 24/7.

The one exception will be the individual group created for a guest expert. For example, the next conference is with guest expert. Mary Ruth Coleman, Ph.D. The date is still being determined. Once the conference begins you can participate and as usual the conference will end when the guest expert finishes. The other groups will function 24/7.

Therefore, you need to be a member of the new Ning OGTOC site and you will also need to join the Mary Ruth Coleman group. Conferences will not be posted to the Yahoo group, but I will keep it as a back up during this beta testing time.

The conference will be in the Forum on that group or otherwise instructed. Please know you have choices for your own settings once you join NING and NING OGTOC. It will depend on your own choices/your own settings how you access the information. Check your own settings

to see the choices - some are:

- 1) receive notifications or not receive any)Choices are available
- 2) IF you choice NO notificiations YOU will need to signin to NING OGTOC navigate to the page titled with the guest expert's name to access any information for OGTOC including the conference. ( please know that there is a group where you can join which is dedicated to information about upcoming conferences. it would be wise to join that one group for notifications to insure you at least know when a conference, etc is taking place. Set your notification choices for that based on your own choices.
- 3) jump in and learn with everyone else yes it is different, but a change is good, right? It is a HUGE change for me, because activity only took place during the conference and now it is 24/7. PLEASE take time to read the NING help FAQ to discover answers to your questions. I would greatly appreciate that as will my family:))))i can only donate so much time, but if it remains totally excessive I will have to reexamine my volunteer choices. I am sure it will work, but just encouraging you to become curious and resourceful on your own;)))

Guest expert groups are by invitation only. You must make an effort to join each time a conference is held. Please note, if you are invited to join a guest expert group or ask to join the guest expert group, or once you are a member of the group and decide to invite another person you must understand that the email address used and the comments that are posted during the conference will not be adjusted, deleted, edited due to a request for online identity issues. Any online identity must be decided in advance of joining NING.

Also the guest experts or members words in this group are not to be copied, forwarded ,transmitted as is the same for any of the groups or their contents anywhere else. All conference proceedings become the work of the guest expert and list owner. Privacy issues are important and you are responsible for your own identity and respect others so all can freely participate among friends.

To clarify, once you are a member of the NING OGTOC social networking site you must explore and chose to join other groups or wait to be invited to some groups. Some conferences which will become a group identified by the guest expert's name, may be free or may not be. Mary Ruth Conference Ph.D. is a free conference to all who request to join her conference. Many offerings will be provided in the future. Much is to evolve so join and enjoy the adventure:)
