Continuity...

A precious commodity which seems to be sadly lacking in many areas affecting gifted education.

I have a friend who is a physiotherapist. Whenever she passes on a patient she provides a complete history of the tests that have been administered, the treatment to date, possible future treatment paths etc.

And that is how it should be in gifted education too. But every year we hear of students having to mark time for the first half of the year because of lack of this type of continuity.

And lack of continuity even affects whole education systems. Whole networks vanish during changes at the system level if the pre-existing information and connections are not passed on.

Gifted Resources newsletter is sent initially to over 1,200 people. Many of these are then sent off through further networks. Some are printed out by psychologists and education consultants and put on display in their waiting rooms. Some are printed out and pinned on staff room notice boards and some are cut up and stuck in the appropriate places in diaries.

Once I knew of most of the further networks and was sure of a good coverage for the schools in Victoria. However this year I realise that with changes in staff positions many of those further networks no longer exist and I am forced to retrace my steps and check whether they are all still functioning.

And that leads to a discussion about succession planning – but that is a topic for another day!
