Having read many books written by some wonderful people and worked with some extremely talented visual thinkers, Glenn feels that it is time to unleash the secrets of visual thinking. The understanding of this difference in how people think has now been given great credence over the last few years and done much to ease the lives of many so called "learning disabled" people.

Whether you think in pictures, words, feelings or a mixture of all these modalities, your learning style is still quite individual. We now know that the greater majority of teachers are auditory sequential learners and also the largest portion of our medical professionals. Understandably, if you are an auditory sequential learner, you will thrive on words, systems and processes.

What is Visual thinking at its best?

Everything that we do in life involves a strategy. To remember something or perform a task, we use the same sequence every time. Visual thinkers usually have poor or inappropriate strategies to think, remember, organise and even write. The major reason this occurs is because the whole world is set up on a system of left brain, auditory sequential reasoning.

Visual Thinking at its best is learning how right brain functioning can be explained in a manner that strengthens a persons strategies, adapting how they use their skills to strengths rather than weaknesses.

How do we do this?

This is an interactive workshop designed to explain just what it is that visual thinkers do in their heads. In this workshop we will explore the realities of visual thinking from a hands on approach to gain a better understanding of what it is that we need to change in order to strengthen the gift of visual thinking.

Glenn is a practitioner of Neuro Linguistic Programming. NLP is a tool used to understand how people do things in the world. We model successful outcomes, breakdown inappropriate and weak strategies, and re form them into better suited ones. Glenn is a whole brained thinker with a preference for visual processing. Having worked with a number of Visual Spatial people he feels it is time for a better understanding of this difference to be explored, worked with and taken out of the realm of difficult.

Giant Research Race steps up a notch

Several thousand young brains around the country are flexing in preparation for one of the year's most exciting school academic contests: The Great Race. This contemporary online competition for primary and secondary school students is based on social science subjects and current world events, and is set to commence its third round on Monday 3 August.

The Great Race is the kingpin in the broad program of finely-tuned learning resources pioneered by Tasmanian company Giant Classroom. The innovative education tool, launched in 2004, has evolved this year into an exhilarating elimination competition concluding an end-of-year Grand Final.

The knockout competition presents students with ten questions each week that are based on a topical international issue. This runs for four five-week rounds, for a total of 20 weeks throughout the year. Recent topics have included the global financial crisis, the Beijing Olympics and Chinese Tibet.

Students submit their answers online and can check their results and rankings against other schools in a friendly real-time environment; creating a "thinking frenzy," as described by former teacher and Giant Classroom founder David Reid.

However, the Great Race also challenges participants to refine their research skills by exploring a variety of information resources, which often proves highly successful in re-engaging students with their school library.

"The look on the students' faces was so precious to me – the sheer glee of gathering knowledge under pressure. If only more learning could take place this way," remarks teacher and Great Race participating coordinator K Bishop of Tamworth of a previous Race.

The third round for the 2009 Great Race knockout competition will commence on Monday 3rd August and the last round on 19th October.

The leading five students from each state after each round will be invited into the Grand Final which will involve answering 30 questions live online in a restricted timeframe. The prize for the winning student will be the choice of either a laptop computer or an iPhone.

My name is Alison Brown. I am a child psychologist working in Malvern. Over the last 6 years I have run a range of social skills workshops for children, focusing on issues of friendship for girls, and communication and social skills for boys. These programs are designed for children in regular schools, experiencing some problems fitting in or socialising.
