"Gifted Introverts from the Inside Out"

Thursday 12 March, 2009, 7.45 - 9.30pm

Introversion is one of Western Society's least valued personality types, and one of the more common personality types found among the gifted population. This personality type stems from physiological traits fundamental to the day-to-day functioning of many gifted children. The implications of these traits extend well beyond the realm of social interaction, impacting areas as diverse as learning styles, energy levels and noise tolerance. These

children bring a special gift to humanity, if that gift is allowed to flourish. Yet they are often incorrectly labeled as shy, antisocial, neurotic or having Asperger's Disorder.

This session will explore the physiological underpinnings of introversion, along with characteristics and needs that stem from this physiology. Practical strategies will be given for teaching and parenting introverted children and teens, helping them gain the most from classroom, home and other settings. No prior knowledge expected.

PROF FRANCOYS GAGNE IN AUSTRALIA



Professor Françoys Gagné, a charming French Canadian from Montreal, obtained his Ph.D. in Educational Psychology (1966) at l'Université de Montréal. After devoting a decade to the study of student evaluations of teaching, he spent the rest of his career in the department of Psychology, at l'Université du Québec à Montréal (UQAM). He soon adopted giftedness as his field of study, a field in which he has published extensively on theoretical matters, peer identification, and motivational issues. He is well known in the U.S.A. and abroad for his Differentiated Model of Giftedness and Talent (DMGT)), which has been endorsed by educational authorities in many countries. Dr. Gagné has won major awards in the field of gifted education, among them NAGC's Distinguished Scholar Award (1996). Since retiring in 2001, Dr. Gagné has maintained international publishing and keynoting activities.


