Is there an ideal education program to cater for the needs of students who are both gifted and have a learning disability?

This entertaining presentation began life as a short chatty blog entry about Jo's sprained ankle and difficulty in finding shoes which could cater for both feet and the connection to finding programs for 2E students. However when she read articles on the topic and started to investigate the type of programs available for both gifted and learning disabled students using Edward De Bono's Six Action Shoes as a framework to consider courses of action; Jo discovered the reasons it is so difficult to cater simultaneously for both the gifted and learning disabled aspects of the twice exceptional student.

Along the way humorous anecdotes and animations and a series of Feetspeak cartoons about the practical problems caused by the sprained ankle help to raise awareness of how it feels to be a 'lame cheetah'

PROF FRANCOYS GAGNE IN AUSTRALIA



Professor Françoys Gagné, a charming French Canadian from Montreal, obtained his Ph.D. in Educational Psychology (1966) at l'Université de Montréal. After devoting a decade to the study of student evaluations of teaching, he spent the rest of his career in the department of Psychology, at l'Université du Québec à Montréal (UQAM). He soon adopted giftedness as his field of study, a field in which he has published extensively on theoretical matters, peer identification, and motivational issues. He is well known in the U.S.A. and abroad for his Differentiated Model of Giftedness and Talent (DMGT)), which has been endorsed by educational authorities in many countries. Dr. Gagné has won major awards in the field of gifted education, among them NAGC's Distinguished Scholar Award (1996). Since retiring in 2001, Dr. Gagné has maintained international publishing and keynoting activities.

Introduction to 'Thinking Outside The Box' Programs

These programs are for children who have been identified as having high ability and are available to students from local schools.

The goals of the programs are to:

- Develop deeper thinking habits and strategies.
- Learn and practise a range of problem-solving skills.
- Foster each child's ability to work in groups of like-minded children.
- Develop reflective skills and encourage students to challenge themselves in any learning environment.
- Build children's confidence in their abilities and increase their expectations about what is achievable.
- Encourage each child to develop and pursue personal interests and passions.
- Develop children's skills at asking 'good' questions based on deeper thinking and evaluation.
- Provide a forum for exploring what it means to be 'gifted' and developing a sense of support and community.

The programs described in this flyer will sometimes also include:

- Use of a range of thinking strategies and learning habits.
- Maths, logic and word challenges designed to stimulate creative thinking and problem solving.

International Women's Day Award for Kate Mitchell

On Wednesday evening I had the pleasure of attending the Eastern Metropolitan Region's International Women's Day dinner. Nominations had been called for women who have made an outstanding contribution to Education.

It was wonderful that Vanessa Reynolds very enthusiastically nominated Kate Mitchell. The nomination submission is reproduced below:

I'd like to nominate Kate Mitchell, Principal here at Box Hill High. Her contribution to the care and education of women and girls has been shown over a long time in her many roles in the school. I have known Kate only for the past four years, and in that time I have seen her mentoring staff, both men and women, but especially giving women the confidence to do their jobs well and to gain the range of skills and experiences to gain promotion and take on leadership roles themselves. She espouses a shared leadership vision, and enables staff to become leaders rather than retaining all leadership and power. This has been particularly obvious in her support for the young women on our staff, and in her ability to spread responsibility around. Before I came to the school, Kate was the Gifted Education coordinator, and organised our SEAL program. She has maintained her strong interest in our gifted students, and continues her research and studies in gifted education at Monash Uni. This shows especially in her care and concern for the girls at our school and in our SEAL classes, because we have more boys than girls enrolled just as most eastern suburbs schools do. To maintain an even balance of girls and boys in SEAL classes, Kate initiated an all boys class when needed in particular years, after researching the impact on the boys and the needs of the girls. She also ensured that the all boys class had a particular focus, so that these students were not disadvantaged. Kate is supporting a program I am starting at the moment to bring gifted primary girls into our school for a short program which is designed to help them to understand and realise their potential regardless of where they plan to go to secondary school. This support includes researching and explaining the needs of these gifted girls to a wider educational and parent community. The program has developed out of my study in gifted education, and Kate is as passionate as I am about helping gifted girls especially, and all girls in general, to achieve their potential.
