

- 1. Change of website address now www.WebPsychologist.com.au Please change your bookmarks.
- 2. Her first book being published on **December 4th**! It is a short book called "**Stomp Out The ANTs**" (ANT is an acronym for Automatic Negative Thoughts) which is ideal for those who have been challenged by depression or anxiety, those who know people who have negative thinking patterns, or those who want to have more control over their thoughts.
- 3. Next "Stomp Out The ANTs" prevention program for children and adolescents from Grade 5 to Year10 runs for 6 weeks next term in the week starting October 19. If your child/teen has a Mental Health Care Plan, it includes up to 12 individual sessions AND up to 12 group sessions, so they can claim a partial rebate through Medicare.
- 4. A new website will be up and running shortly called "Cyber Psych". Sally-Anne has been doing a lot of media interviews with regards to Cyber Bullying as well as Internet Addiction. On ABC 774 radio on **October 5th** from **3pm 4pm** she will be participating in an interesting interview with some audio clips of teens who have been involved in Cyber Bullying (both victims AND perpetrators).
