Twice-Exceptional Children!

Why do some students apply little or no effort to school tasks while they commit considerable time and effort to demanding, creative activities outside of school? These behaviours are typical of some students who are simultaneously gifted and learning disabled. For many people, however, the terms learning disabilities and giftedness are at opposite ends of a learning continuum.

Who are the Twice-Exceptional (2E) Children? Children who are both gifted and learning disabled exhibit remarkable talents or strengths in some areas and disabling weaknesses in others. They can be grouped into three categories: 1. Identified gifted students who have subtle learning disabilities. 2. Unidentified students whose gifts and disabilities may be masked by average achievement. 3. Identified learning disabled students who are also gifted.

> In this workshop you will learn effective strategies and skills to re engage 2E students who have disengaged from learning because of learning difficulties, learning differences or behavioural issues.


Jo Freitag, who is the mother of four gifted children coordinates the Information Service, Gifted Researces which has an office at The Centre for the Exceptional Learner, Lether College, Croydon, Victoria. Jo has worked in public and achool libraries and has home-obscrited two of her children at secondary level. She produces the Giffed Reconces website and newslatter, develope the Offled Resources Film Discussion suries and has given presentations at Teacher professional development exestions, Oiffed Education Conferences and national and intermational Homeschooling Conferences.

Maxine Cowie, Director of Starjamp embacked on a journey to find practical and effective teaching methods for visual spatial learners, which make up an estimated 30% of the population. This areas from hat experience with working with aboriginal children, who are posternizately visual spatial learners and experiencing the ineffectiveness of traditional teaching methods with these children. Visual spatial learners often straggle in the classroom and end upbeing labeled as trouble makers and difficult students. Maxine has developed a holistic program for visual spatial learners which has been encountfully implemented in schools in Victoria and NSW. Maxime currently trains teachers in her techniques so that they can run the program within their school environment. Her passion is to ensure student's learn and gain self confidence by using their cognitive strengths and passions so that they experience success both in the school environment and in their lives.
