In this issue of the Gifted Resources newsletter you will find information about several interesting conferences, workshops, guest speaker evenings and PD sessions.



* Children of high intelligence with one or more developmental differences are sometimes described as twice-exceptional (2e) because they are exceptional in 2 ways. First, they are gifted (one exceptionality) and second, they have one or more additional special needs (the other exceptionality), such as a specific learning disability, a medical condition (eg, ADHD), a physical disability, a behaviour disorder or a social or emotional issue (eg, anxiety) – in short, the gifted child "with something else going on" which interferes with school achievement and/or social/emotional well-being.

The 2e* Forum will provide an opportunity for parents, educators and other professionals supporting 2e children to engage in a day of learning, discussion, sharing and planning. Presenters will include leading professionals, classroom practitioners, parents and young people who are themselves 2e. The program will feature both formal sessions and informal discussions. The Forum will also generate a report on the importance of early recognition of 2e learners and strategies to lift the "lazy", "bored" and "naughty" masks to reveal the gifts beneath.

Keynote Speaker: Dr Mark Selikowitz is a Sydney consultant developmental paediatrician. He has extensive experience in treating children with developmental differences and is the author of several books.

Preparing Gifted Students for the NAPLAN

In just a few weeks time students all over Australia in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will be sitting the NAPLAN. The assessments are designed to provide students, parents and schools with valuable information about student progress and school performance. Much discussion has taken place about tests being just a “snapshot” of student performance at one particular point in time. Furthermore, these tests have generated discussion about how much classroom instructional time should be spent preparing students for the NAPLAN as opposed to engaging students in a relevant curriculum.

Vice President of the Victorian Association for Gifted and Talented Children (VAGTC) Michael Bond says that there is now a greater emphasis on ensuring that all students achieve on assessments. “Three years ago I think people were concerned about how struggling students would perform on the NAPLAN. Now there seems to be a greater emphasis on ensuring that the high achievers and gifted and talented students are also performing on NAPLAN.”

Mr Bond said that there are many reasons why gifted students are underachieving on NAPLAN and in the regular classroom. “Often gifted students are not challenged during their primary school years and they can then become disengaged with school. Many gifted students are bored and thus develop poor work habits.” Mr. Bond went on to say, “The key is to identify and engage gifted students in the curriculum as early as possible.”

There are a number of strategies that schools can implement to assist gifted students. Some simple strategies include:

- Some form of grouping for gifted and talented students in advance classes or pull-out programs.
- Provision of appropriate extra-curriculum programs that may include during school and after school activities.
- Supportive adults in the school setting that may include teachers, counsellors or mentors.
- Assisting gifted students in developing a peer group.
- Providing an engaging curriculum that is differentiated to meet the needs of the gifted student.

The VAGTC will be holding their biannual conference on September 8 and 9 this year. The conference is called “Unmasking the Possibilities”. This conference is aiming to enable participants to become more proficient in understanding and identifying the 75% of students who for multiple reasons present in schools with masked gifts and talents. 
