Ford Street Literature Festival for Kids

I thought you and some of the gifted students in your network might be interested in the Ford Street Literature Festival for Kids on 19th November.

There will be fourteen illustrators and authors at the festival (including me) talking about our work and how we create it. Some of the other authors are Paul Collins, Meredith Costain, Hazel Edwards and Justin D'Ath, and Marc McBride will be doing an illustration demonstration.

The festival is for primary and secondary students and will be hosted by Scotch College, Hawthorn on November 19 between 10.30am and 1.30pm.

The event is open to students from Year 5 – Year 9. For \$20, they will receive light refreshments such as cakes, fruit platters, soft drinks and a gift bag of giveaways including a free book from Ford Street Publishing plus three hours of literature related activities. Students will be required to bring their own lunch, and need to be accompanied by one adult per 10 students and adults are admitted free.

FROM GERRIC

Dear parents,

GERRIC is beginning to plan our January 2011 programs for gifted and talented students and I have to tell you that regretfully there will be a significant change in the programs we are able to offer next year.

For 2011, at least, we are putting our two younger student programs, *Poppyseeds* and *Small Poppies*, on hold. This has not been an easy decision but it is one that we have made after much thought and with the advice and support of GERRIC's Management Committee. These two programs are particularly expensive to run because of the *very* low student/teacher ratios we must adhere to in order to ensure the smooth running of these younger children's programs and, most importantly, the safety of the young children while they are on campus. For several years GERRIC has run these two programs at a financial loss, as a service to the community, but we cannot continue this indefinitely. As you may be aware, GERRIC is a **self-funding** Centre. My position as a professor in the School of Education is funded by the university but the salaries of all other GERRIC staff, including the casual staff (teachers) who teach the student program workshops during their vacations, are funded by the Centre itself from the finances accruing from our various programs.

Junior Scientia and *Scientia Challenge*, which serve older students, do not require such low student-teacher ratios, and therefore are able to break even in terms of costs and income. We are therefore able to continue to offer these two programs. Children will be eligible to enrol in *Junior Scientia* from January of the year in which they enter School Year 3.

I know that this will be a disappointment to you but I hope that you will understand our situation and the decision we have had to take.
