

Identifying and supporting development in young gifted children.

This seminar will focus on identifying, understanding and supporting early giftedness, from infancy to beginning school. It will consider a number of issues around giftedness in early childhood, including discussion of the following:

- Vygotsky's zone of proximal development as a useful concept for parents and educators of young gifted children.
- The value of play for developing thinking and creativity.
- Consideration of issues and challenges for early childhood education and care programmes in providing for young gifted children.
- Transition to school

Anne-Marie Morrissey is a Senior Lecturer in Early Childhood Education at Deakin University. She has a long-standing interest in early gifted development and education, and has researched and published internationally in this area. She has recently published an introductory text on young gifted children for parents and early childhood educators. Anne-Marie has also had extensive experience as a teacher and director in kindergartens childcare centres and primary schools, and 11 years a moderator for the National Childcare Accreditation Council. She is also a member of the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority's Early Years Learning and Advisory Group.

Making the differentiated curriculum meaningful for gifted students

Too often we worry about the identification of a gifted student and not about the curriculum differentiation that should be developed to meet the needs of the gifted students. Through the examination of one school's policy to ensure gifted students' needs are met the curriculum differentiation will be analysed to see how the content, process, products and environment has been altered to challenge the students in their regular classroom.

Dr Diana Whitton is an associate professor in education with responsibilities for teaching pre-service and in-service teachers in gifted and talented education, service learning and primary education. Following teaching in both England and New South Wales primary schools she took up an appointment at the University of Western Sydney.

Throughout her teaching career she has studied various facets of education including:

- teacher librarianship and children's literature;
- curriculum development;
- creative arts;
- service learning; and,
- the education of gifted and talented children.

Following the completion of two honours Master of Education degrees through Wollongong and Charles Sturt universities, Diana completed the doctoral program at the University of Connecticut.

From Pat Slattery WiseOnes Australia P/L

The Victorian Government Inquiry into Gifted Education asked WiseOnes what we could provide for rural and smaller schools. We had started to look at this and had already researched some web conferencing services. We were too far ahead of our times then but now we can. I trialled 37 different service providers but all were set up to suit older people who could already read and write and use chat and be patient with delays. We needed a round table type conference with laughter and interruptions..

Using Cloud technology and browser based services we can now, a year later, provide for the six to twelve year olds face to face with audio and video in sync. We have modified the docs to pdf and the videos to flv to fit the reduced quality needed for the internet. That itself was a major job as we have so many resources for the faster learners.

The new provision is called **A Faster Group** and the website is www.afastergroup.com.au. As this can be used globally we have changed the website colours to green and gold to promote this Australian initiative. Already children in schools in Victoria are enrolled fo 25th October. Already we have visited the schools from Mt Isa to Townsville telling them about our new service. The idea was very well received in these more remote places.

I will be very happy to take sponsorship to pay the provider from any respectable sponsor who will pay the monthly fee as we try to keep the price down . We are parents of gifted children too.. We will even put a “sponsored by” logo on the website. What a way to celebrate our 15 years in Gifted Education!
