I have decided to retire from my work in the gifted community and it will happen in just a few weeks time.

After 12 years working intensely with gifted children and their families it is time for me to move on. I have spent a lot of time recently (not just while I was walking) working out how I was going to move forward. I considered all sorts of different options and models but the reality is that Thinking Ahead is just me (with occasional help from my family when they are pressed into service) and to be able to have the flexibility I want, to be able to spend more time at my farm and on the creative pursuits that nurture me, and to travel with my husband I can't continue to work directly with families.

My books will continue to be available as will the website (with some new materials which are currently in production) but the blog and Facebook pages will soon no longer be active. The information on the blog will remain, but I will not be posting after the end of June.

The June newsletter will be the last regular newsletter I will send out packed with a collection of links. There may be other newsletters at times when there is something that I really want to pass on, but not on a regular basis. And of course, there won't be any further consultations. When I wrote The Beginner's Guide to Life on the Bright Side it was, largely, an effort to 'clone myself' as it was difficult to be available to all the parents who were contacting me. It is really a 'consultation in a book', as it covers all the topics and questions that parents want to know about when we meet, ready for you to apply it to your own situation. The book format allows you to revisit the information as often as you need to, something that you can't do with a face to face meeting. I will be directing those who contact me to my books as the first step in their journey in the land of gifted, and can also pass people on to my colleague Tracy Taylor, who does a very limited number of consultations with families, if the need arises.

Have you had a look at the Thinking Ahead website lately? The new look site has been live for a few weeks now, and although there is more to add now I have returned, you should find most things there, but with a fresh new look.

Personality in Play

Are you a parent or guardian of a child aged 5 to 7 years? We need your help!

Monash University's **Personality and Individual Differences** research team is seeking parent and child participants for play-observation research investigating the behavioural markers of child personality traits.

To be eligible to participate, we require that your child have no diagnosed developmental delay, and both you and your child are English-speaking.

As part of this research, you and your child will be invited to play for a total of 45 minutes in three different settings, including free-play in a play-room, completing a creative task, and free-play on a play-ground. These play activities will be conducted at Monash University's Clayton campus and will be video-recorded for later analysis. You will also be invited to complete an online personality survey about your child. After participating in this research, you will receive a feedback report summarising your child's personality profile from a registered educational and developmental psychologist.

Your participation in this research will greatly assist in the development of the first play-based personality measure for young children.
