Helping gifted children and young adolescents make and keep friends

Thursday 14 March 2013

7.45pm - 9.30pm



Psychologist Murray Evely will present an important seminar looking at the individual needs of children and young adolescents when it comes to assisting them to develop friendships. He will address the ways in which parents can encourage and teach their children essential friendship and social competency skills.

Friendship is an important part of any child's development. For many children and young adolescents, making and keeping friends seems to be quite effortless but for others it can be a challenge. Whether it be giftedness, shyness, difficulty relating to others, impulsive behaviour or a specific disability - repeated problems with friendship groups can lead children to feelings of loneliness, isolation and sadness.

Together we will explore some of the key strategies parents can use to help their child achieve greater success with peer acceptance and in making and keeping friendships.

About the presenter: Murray Evely has extensive experience as a teacher-trained psychologist providing practical, hands-on resources and advice to parents, principals, teachers and school communities. Murray works across schools of varying sizes, types and demographics, conducts a part-time practice and for many years, consulted with two private hospitals in Melbourne. He has been a Victorian Department of Education Psychology Stream Leader. He currently works one day a week for the Australian Psychological Society as a Professional Advisor as well as consulting to schools on a weekly basis. In 2011, Murray - along with fellow psychologist Zoe Ganim - launched an exciting new website for schools - www.psych4schools.com.au which has a membership subscription base of schools and school professionals from across Australia.







Dyslexia for Dads

Short Course

Dyslexia for Dads has been designed in recognition of the unique and vital role dads and other men play in creating better outcomes for children impacted by Specific Learning Difficulties/ Dyslexia (SLD). Running for three consecutive weeks, this SLD short course is aimed at those dads/carers who want to play a more active part in the management of their child's SLD but are unsure how to do so. The individual units for "Dyslexia for Dads" are as follows:

Unit 1: Dyslexia101 for Dads

- · A focus on the unique role of dads in managing SLD;
- · A broad-based examination of different types of SLD;
- How to gain a tailored recognition and understanding of your own child's SLD;
- How to develop appropriate SLD management strategies, tailored to the needs of your child.

- · How to gain a balanced perspective of SLD affected children;
- · Recognising the impact of stress, and anxiety in managing SLD;

- An examination of effective home/school partnerships;
- The rights and responsibilities of dads, families and school communities;
