What does this term actually mean and does it mean the same thing for all children; or, the same thing for parents as it does for teachers?





Partners in the Education of Gifted Children

Catherine Wormald

Catherine Wormald is first and foremost a parent of three gifted children who are now adults. She started out as a secondary math teacher and moved into the field of gifted education. She has worked across education sectors, as a gifted education consultant for the DEC, in the Selective Schools Unit and is currently Secondary Course Coordinator at the University of Notre Dame. Her PhD research studied the reasons for a lack of identification of students who are gifted with learning disabilities.



Discussion is currently taking place by governments about the quality of students entering universities to study teaching and the quality of teacher graduates. The feeling is that both these standards need to be raised if Australia is to improve its international ranking on world tests such as PISA. Therefore what are undergraduates taught at university to prepare them to become teachers? In particular are these teachers being adequately prepared to meet the challenge of teaching students who are gifted? Additionally teachers may need to recognise that these students may also demonstrate difficulties in their learning. Do these courses prepare them for teaching in the 21st century? What would a list look like of things that exist today that did not exist 20 or 30 years ago? In light of that list teachers are faced with challenges today that are different to those of twenty years ago. This presentation will give an overview of teaching training and the challenges faced by new teachers. Additionally it will provide opportunity for participants to have input into how they feel these challenges can be met through school communities working together and in particular what teachers and other relevant professionals can do to increase their knowledge and experience in meeting the educational needs of gifted students.
